## National Award Winner

Our Entrepreneurship Coordinator Jeruzye was chosen as the best young entrepreneur in Malawi by the Indian High Commission, beating 400 other nominees. His vision and strategy have been instrumental in the development of our village savings and loans groups, which have collectively saved over \$30,000! # Christian Outreach

The demand for Christian outreach services has increased. We now have more than 70 Bible study groups and have grown beyond our four main communities. Due to the demand, we trained 20 additional Bible study leaders. We have seen lives changed for the better because of the genuine desire for the Gospel.



# Agriculture



We helped 50 households grow enough food for the year. Some, like McCloud pictured above, had such a successful crop that we highlighted their farms when government officials and other partners came to see Pamoza's exemplary programs.

# Health Care

We continued to partner with local health workers in Malawi to host weekly clinics and have been able to treat more than 2,000 people this year! The major challenge is the rising cost of medicine, which costs us roughly \$700

per month. Most people come to our clinic because they'll receive good service.



# Entrepreneurship



Our village banks allow members to collectively save and borrow from their group to meet their financial needs. Albert and his wife bought goats with a loan they took from their group, and are now one of the most reputable local suppliers for goat meat. **"I will now be able to pay school fees for my children and provide for my family because of this program."** - Albert

# Education

Education needs in Malawi are vast, but we are making strides. This year, we started 3 more adult literacy centers, continued school breakfast for 1,400+ students, and supported 9 college students and 42 high school students with school fees. To this day, high school is still not free in Malawi!
