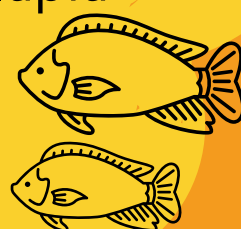
Agriculture & Food Security

At the Pamoza Farming Institute we grew beans, peanuts, bananas, and lots of vegetables.



Last Year We:

- Distributed 100 bags of fertilizer
- Started 9 fish ponds for raising tilapia
- Supported 5 school farms



We are helping families move beyond subsistence farming by modeling income-generating activities such as poultry farming, aquaculture, and growing cash crops.

Education & Vocational Skills

We continued our adult literacy centers, vocational skills training, school breakfast program, and scholarships.

Tailoring Skills Training



Wongani, our tailoring skills instructor, taught 17 women to sew, and has been teaching girls how to make their own reusable menstrual pads so they can attend school every day.



Served breakfast to 2,495 children every school day.



Gave 30 scholarships (20 for high school and 10 for college)



Enrolled 48 learners in adult literacy class



Hosted the Girls Rise Conference for 57 promising 7th graders.

Economic Empowerment

We facilitated Village Savings and Loans groups, provided corn milling services, and ran the Pamoza Cooperative, which provides capital to members to engage in agribusiness.
