Our C.H.I.E.F. focus areas:

Christian Outreach

Hearing the Gospel is where true transformation begins.



- **13,733** students reached through weekly Bible lessons.
- **302** people accepted Christ!
- **115** married couples in our Family Life Skills program.
- **48** pastors trained on Biblical leadership.

Health Care

The nearest “hospital” is 6 miles from most of our families. Our clinic provides health services closer to home.

Income Generation

70% of Malawians live on less than \$2.15 a day. We work to increase income-earning opportunities. In 2023, we:

Launched **3 AgriDepots** where people can **buy** farm supplies and **sell** produce.

Engaged **151 community members** in village banks.

Made **2 million kwacha** (about \$2,000) selling produce from our demonstration farm.



“Being part of a village bank has really made a difference. Last year, I saved 80,000 kwacha! That helped me pay school fees for my children.”

Education & Vocational Skills

Nelson Mandela said, "Education is the most powerful weapon you can use to change the world." In 2023, we:

- Launched the **Girls Rise Scholarship** fund led by our high school volunteer, Mackenzie Duffy.
- Provided school **breakfast** to **2,470** students.
- Taught **45 adults** how to read and write.
- Provided scholarships to **19** students **in college** and **24** students **in high school** (not free in Malawi).
- Added **5 electric sewing machines** at our tailoring skills building which now has solar electricity!

Food Security & Agriculture

Every single family we serve lives off the land. Food insecurity is a constant threat. In 2023, we:



Supported **9 community farms** where corn and soya are grown for the school breakfast program.



Established the **Joseph Food Bank** to help food-insecure families. We bought enough corn to help **2,000+ families** when they run out of food.



Planted corn, beans, onions, tomatoes, bananas, and **72 fruit trees** at Pamoza Farming Institute.
